



The 4th edition of the **International Conference on Sustainability, Technology and Education** was held in Florianópolis, Santa Catarina, Brazil (**30 November – 2 December, 2015**).

This conference was organized by the International Association for Development of the Information Society (IADIS) and co-organized by the Universidade Federal de Santa Catarina and by UNISINOS

The International Conference on Sustainability, Technology and Education (STE 2015) aimed to address the main issues which occur by assessing the relationship between Sustainability, Education and Technology.



This edition was published jointly with the international conferences: Educational Technologies (ICEduTech 2015) and International Conference on Internet Technologies & Society (ITS 2015). In total, these conferences received 87 submissions from more than 15 countries. Each submission was reviewed in a double-blind review process by an average of four independent reviewers to ensure quality and maintain high standards. Out of the papers submitted, 11 got blind referee ratings that published them as full papers, which meant that the acceptance rate was 13%. Some other submissions were published as short papers and posters.

In addition to the presentation of full papers, short papers and posters, the conference program also featured one keynote presentation by Roberta Lingnau de Oliveira, Neoway, Brasil and Michel Avila, Neoway, Brasil.
